Kyenjojo residents trained to repair access roads

Residents of Nyantungo and Katooke sub-counties in Kyenjojo district have been trained and empowered to repair community access roads in their areas.

The residents, who were trained by the Japanese government, through the Community Road Empowerment project (CORE), were also equipped with tools to work on the roads.

Juliet Kansiime, a resident of Katooke, on Saturday, during the commissioning of a road which was repaired by the trainees, said the area around Kajurua swamp has been characterised by a poor road network, despite their pleas to Katooke sub-county authorities to repair it.

She said many women in the area were unable to access maternity health services due to the poor roads.

Yuka Lwamura, the project co-ordinator of CORE, said they have empowered communities to be self-reliant.

Newton Isaac Friday, the roads engineer for Kyenjojo district, said the trainees will help to improve the state of roads in the district.

Mwenge Central County Member of Parliament Col. Tom Butime said the involvement of communities in the construction of roads will improve the road network in the area.
