# Busia. Youths trained on construction of roads

The county has partnered with private organisations to provide training for unemployed youth. Governor Sospeter Ojaamong said after the training the youths would be absorbed into the county's workforce or facilitated to start their own businesses. The governor was speaking yesterday at a ceremony to honour 100 youths in Madende, Nambale constituency, who had completed a training course on the construction of roads and bridges, which was conducted by Japan's Community Road Empowerment (CORE).
